Bill Duncan gave an animated and very competent rendering of "Tam o' Shanter", followed later by "Tae a Louse". Chris Egerton talked about the Burns Foundation and delivered a most amusing poem about the undesirable effects of consuming haggis. Rabbie's Rabble were joined by Neil Edwards and Jim Hannan to celebrate the power of booze in "Wullie Brewed a Peck o Maut" and the whole event ended with everyone singing "Scots Wha Hae" followed by "Auld Lang Syne".
